RAITT TO BE JOINED BY MEMBERS OF LONGTIME TOURING BAND



Bonnie Raitt is heading back out on tour just months after being recognized for her lifetime of artistic achievements as part of the Kennedy Center's 47th Class of Honorees in Washington, DC this December. Raitt and her world-class band will headline theaters around the country performing songs from her enduring catalog. Raitt's vigorous tour has taken her across the U.S. and Canada with stops overseas in Australia, England, Ireland and Scotland, since the release of her critically acclaimed, three-time GRAMMY Award-winning studio album, *Just Like That...* in 2022.

The tour will make a Albuquerque stop at Kiva Auditorium on Saturday, March 8th, 2025. Tickets will go on sale to the public this Friday, November 22 at 10 a.m. MT at [Ticketmaster.com](https://www.ticketmaster.com).

Raitt made an unexpected splash in music industry headlines last month when English singer-songwriter Charli XCX via her collaborator Justin Vernon sampled and interpolated "Nick of Time," the title track from Raitt's 1989 release that earned the GRAMMY Award for Album of the Year. The new track "I think about it all the time featuring bon iver" is included on Charli's new remix album, *Brat and It's Completely Different But Also Still Brat*, and whose message about "running out of time" has resonated with younger generations just as it did for Raitt's contemporaries 35 years ago. "Well, luckily, there are people like Charli and Justin who are drawn to my music," Raitt says. "When I started, I was idolizing my heroes like Sippie Wallace, Muddy Waters, and Judy Collins, and now I get to be appreciated like they were. I'll take it, and wear it with pride."

ABOUT BONNIE RAITT

Bonnie Raitt is a singer, songwriter, and guitarist whose unique style blends blues, R&B, rock, and pop. After 20 years as a cult favorite, she broke through to the top in the early 90s with her GRAMMY-award-winning albums, *Nick of Time* and *Luck of the Draw*, which featured hits, "Something To Talk About" and "I Can't Make You Love Me" among others. The thirteen-time GRAMMY winner was inducted into the Rock & Roll Hall of Fame in 2000 and Rolling Stone named the slide guitar ace one of the "100 Greatest Guitarists of All Time" and one of the "100 Greatest Singers of All Time."

2023 kicked off with Raitt earning three GRAMMY™ Awards at the 65th Annual ceremony; Song Of The Year and Best American Roots Song for the title track of her most recent album "Just Like That...", and Best Americana Performance for "Made Up Mind." Raitt was as well acknowledged for the Recording Academy Lifetime Achievement Award she was honored with the year prior. Raitt has been on tour for most of 2023 and 2024 with stops in the U.S., Australia, the UK, Ireland, Scotland and Canada.

2022 was as well an incredible year for Raitt with a 75-date headlining U.S. tour; the release of her critically acclaimed 21st album 'Just Like That...' on her independent label, Redwing Records; receiving the Icon Award at this 2022's Billboard Women In Music Awards and seeing her breakthrough album, 'Nick of Time' added to the Library of Congress' National Recording Registry. 'Just Like That...' was #1 on six Billboard charts the week of release and was perched at #1 on the Americana Radio Album Chart for ten consecutive weeks. The album's first single, "Made Up Mind" remained in the top three spots on the Americana Radio Singles Chart for 17 weeks.

As known for her lifelong commitment to social activism as she is for her music, Raitt has long been involved with the environmental movement, performing concerts around oil, nuclear power, mining, water, and forest protection since the mid '70s. She was a founding member of MUSE (Musicians United for Safe Energy), which produced the historic concerts, album and

film NO NUKES (1979,) as well as a founding member of The Rhythm and Blues Foundation, which works for royalty reform and recognition of generations of pioneer R&B artists. She continues to work on safe energy issues in addition to environmental protection, social justice, Native American and human rights, as well as artist's rights and music education.

ABOUT DANNY ZELISKO PRESENTS

Danny Zelisko began promoting shows in Arizona, in 1974, as a 19 year old transplant from Chicago. He soon founded the legendary concert promotion firm, Evening Star Productions, making the southwest a viable stop on most tours, producing thousands of shows over the years in Arizona, Las Vegas and New Mexico and eventually, all over the USA. Danny proudly partnered Grateful Dead shows with Bill Graham Presents in Phoenix and Las Vegas in the 80s and 90s, which helped transform this area of the country into a concert hotbed that benefitted from this vision, to this day. After a brief dalliance with the corporate world of concert producing, Zelisko went solo again in 2011, producing thousands of shows since with many of his favorite acts that he grew up with, in the business, focusing locally on the Celebrity Theatre and Talking Stick Resort. In 2020, Danny put out a book to unanimous acclaim called ALL EXCE\$\$, covering his life and career over the years, available on Amazon. As a huge music fan, his current plans include booking even more shows all over the country, making sure that people all over feel the LIVE ON STAGE excitement of the great bands he has been exposed to since The Beatles put out their first record in 1963. THERE IS NOTHING LIKE A GREAT LIVE CONCERT is the mantra!
