WHEREAS, Bueno Foods' purpose is to provide for its employees, customers and community through high-quality jobs and delicious products and it has done so for three-fourths of a century;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO that Bueno Foods be recognized for its exemplary business and the celebration of its seventy-fifth anniversary; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that February 6, 2026 be declared "Bueno Foods Day" in the House of Representatives.
